







### Lesson Two 📿 Day One

#### My Heart to Yours ...

As we begin Lesson Two, my heart is full thinking about the journey ahead for you in these chapters of Joshua. From the opening words where God commissions Joshua, to the crossing of the Jordan and the setting up of memorial stones, this section of Scripture is rich with reminders of God's faithfulness and His call to trust Him in every step.

It's not hard to imagine how overwhelming it must have been for Joshua to step into Moses' role as leader of Israel. But through every challenge, God reassured him with the promise of His presence and power. Over and over, we hear the refrain: "Be strong and courageous." God didn't promise an easy path, but He did promise to go with them and provide everything they needed for the journey.

In these next ten days, we'll walk with the Israelites as they prepare to enter the land God promised to their ancestors. We'll see how God parted the waters of the Jordan just as He did at the Red Sea. We'll hear how He called them to set up memorial stones—zecher—to proclaim His mighty deeds to future generations. And we'll be reminded that God's story of faithfulness is not just for the past; it's for us today.

As you reflect on these passages, I invite you to consider the "memorial stones" in your own life. What moments of God's faithfulness stand out to you? How has He made a way for you, provided for you, or strengthened you when you felt unsure? By the end of this lesson, you'll have the opportunity to create and share a "stone of remembrance" that points to God's work in your life.

You may not feel ready now, and that's okay. Maybe the days ahead will remind you of something you've forgotten or reveal something new about God's presence in your life. My prayer for you is that as we journey together through these chapters, you'll see more clearly the ways God has been faithful to you—and that you'll step forward in faith, trusting Him for what's ahead.

I'm excited for you to discover all that God has for you in this lesson. I'm praying for you as you begin, that your heart will be open to His Word, and that by the time we reach the end, you'll have your own "stone of remembrance" to celebrate and share.

Let's step into the waters together and trust that He will lead us through.



#### Lesson Two /Day Nine - Joshua 4:15-5:1

#### Theme: The God Who Completes what He Begins

**Introduction:** As we study Joshua 4:15–5:1, we'll see how God's power, faithfulness, and provision are celebrated in the memorial of the stones and in the fear that spreads among Israel's enemies. This passage challenges us to reflect on how God finishes His work in our lives and points us to the ultimate completion found in Jesus.

#### Thinking Back ...

1. God's Steadfast Presence: Reflect on Joshua 3:7-13 and how the ark of the covenant symbolized God's presence leading the people into the Jordan. How does God's presence in the crossing assure His people of His continued guidance?

#### Dwelling in the Word ...

**2. God's Command to Joshua:** In Joshua 4:15-18, God commands Joshua to bring the priests and the ark out of the Jordan. Why was it significant that God gave specific instructions for both entering and exiting the Jordan? How does this demonstrate God's order and care?

**3. The Miracle's Conclusion:** As soon as the priests' feet touch dry ground, the waters of the Jordan return to their full flow (Joshua 4:18). What does this say about God's timing and control over creation? How might this have strengthened the Israelites' faith?

**4. Significant Timing:** Joshua 4:19 notes the exact day when the people came up from the Jordan. What day was it? \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ Why is this significant? Read Exodus 12:1-3 to learn what God commanded Israel to do on this same date during their time in Equpt.

### Lesson Two 📿 Day Nine

5. The Stones as a Witness: Joshua 4:20-24 emphasizes that the memorial stones were to serve as a sign for future generations and a testimony to all the earth of God's power. Underline the word "when" in verse 21. "When" indicates an expectation that others WILL ask about the stones. Read Matthew 5:14-16 and 1 Peter 3:15. How can Jesus' teachings remind you to live? What does Peter's point say to you about the stone you set up in your life? What might go wrong with the expectation of being asked? Why might your children or others in your life not ask? How can you live in a way that prompts curiosity about your faith and prepares you to share God's story of faithfulness?

6. A Step of Faith: Imagine being one of the priests carrying the ark as the waters of the Jordan surged back into place behind you. What emotions might you feel as you step onto dry land? Write or draw a reflection about how this moment reflects God's faithfulness to you in your own life.

**7. Hearts Melt with Fear:** Joshua 5:1 describes how the Canaanite kings responded with fear when they heard about the Jordan crossing. What does this reveal about the power of God's reputation? How does this fear fulfill God's promise and pave the way for Israel's next steps?

8. Strong and Courageous. Read Philippians 1:6 and Hebrews 12:2. How does the completion of the Jordan crossing point to God's faithfulness to finish what He starts in our lives? How does this remind you of Jesus, who both began and completed the work of our salvation? How can you trust Him today to bring His work in your life to completion?

#### Lesson Two/Day Ten - Create and "Zechar"

Take a moment to reflect on the journey we've walked together through Joshua 1:1–5:1. We've seen God's power part rivers, His faithfulness in fulfilling promises, and His call to trust Him as He leads His people. Like the Israelites, we are reminded that God is always with us, calling us to step forward in faith and remember His work in our lives.

God asked the Israelites to set up memorial (Zechar) stones so future generations would know and proclaim His mighty deeds. Today, we're invited to do something similar: to reflect on what God has done in our lives, celebrate His faithfulness, and boldly share His story with others.

Maybe you're thinking, "I don't have much to share," or, "What I've learned isn't as significant as someone else's story." Let me encourage you: every step of faith is significant, and every story matters because it's part of God's story. You don't need to have the perfect words or a dramatic testimony—God simply asks for a willing heart.

This isn't about comparison; it's about celebration. God has been at work in each of us, and sharing what He's done builds up the faith of those around us. Take time to consider what God has accomplished in your life. Trusting that He can use your story to encourage others.

Those who crossed the Jordan went back to the very spot where the God showed up in power. They picked up a stone large enough that it had to be carried on their shoulder – big enough to be seen, not stuffed into a pocket or pouch.

God could have instructed them to look back on that spot on the Jordan and write about it, but instead He instructed them to go to that spot and pick up a stone so big that it couldn't be missed.

1) Think of a time when God showed His faithfulness to you. What would be a large reminder of that moment? Maybe it's a keepsake, a photo, or a journal entry from that time. If nothing tangible comes to mind, think about a symbol—like a stone or another object—that could represent what God has done for you.

2) Write a prayer of thanks to God for His faithfulness in that moment. If you can, bring a photo of your "memorial stone" or the actual item to our next Grace Group meeting, ready to share how God has been at work in your life.

3) Consider how this moment might encourage someone else, whether in our group or beyond. Joshua 4:24 says the stones were a sign for "all the peoples of the earth." Your story is part of God's story if you are obeying Him. Sharing it boldly can glorify Him and inspire others to trust Him more deeply.
