- Marching in Silence: The power of patient obedience.
- Ark of the Covenant Leading the Way: God's presence at the center.
- Why Silence?
 - o Patience Waiting on God's timing.
 - o Discipline Controlling speech and emotions.
 - o Trust Obedience even when things seem illogical.

V. The Seventh Day: Victory Through Faith (Joshua 6:15-21)

- The Seven Circuits & The Shout: Obedience leads to breakthrough.
- What Did They Shout? The missing detail—so we don't idolize a formula.
- Total Destruction & The Devotion of the City to God: Understanding God's justice and mercy.

- God's Grace to a Sinner: Rahab and her family are saved.
- A Picture of Salvation: Faith and obedience lead to inclusion in God's people.

- Future Fulfillment: In 1 Kings 16:34, the curse is fulfilled in the days of Ahab.
- Lesson: Do not rebuild what God has torn down.

- 1. **Trust God's Timing** Obedience often requires waiting.
- 2. **God's Victory is Through Faith, Not Strength** The battle was won by divine power, not human might.
- 3. **Align with God, Not the Other Way Around** True faith means submitting fully to His plan.
- 4. God's Mercy is Greater Than Our Past Like Rahab, we are grafted into God's family.
- 5. **Spiritual Preparation Before Battle** Consecrate yourself before stepping into God's promises.
